> A local ready mix concrete producer, and a Euclid admixture user (smart
> folks!) is submitting a mix design for a project in Los Angeles.
> Their concrete mix design submittal fully meets the requirements of ACI 318
> and with qualified back up data coming from the "field experience method".
  The listed admixtures comply to the appropriate ASTM standards (also
> required in 318).
> They asked me to clarify the information that you and I discussed in your
> meeting room a few months ago, that the City of LA Dept of Building and
> Safety is no longer in the "admixture approval business" based upon the
> changes in the most recent CBC codes.
                                         Going forward, concrete mix
> submittals must meet ACI 318.
> The older UBC stated that "the admixtures used in concrete shall be subject
> to prior approval by the building official". This was the basis for the
> department approving admixtures for concrete separately from mix submittals.
  That statement is no longer a part of the building code documents.
> latest CBC, chapter 19, states, "structural concrete shall be designed and
> constructed with the requirements of this chapter (19) and ACI 318 as
> amended by 1908A of this code."
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> I appreciate your reply and confirmation to this so they can submit their > concrete mix submittal with confidence thru the normal channels required for > this project.
